

This year's ballots will be done electronically. You will receive an email with a link and text that reads as follows:

Click this <u>link</u> for online voting. Thank you for voting.

After clicking on that link, you will automatically be directed to a Google Forms page titled Nashville AGO Elections. From there, select your candidates, one for dean-elect, secretary, and treasurer, and three for representatives. At the bottom of the page, click on SUBMIT. Be sure to double check your selections before hitting SUBMIT as there is no way to change your vote after clicking SUBMIT. All voting is anonymous.

Elections will open April 1 and votes can be submitted any time up to April 15. If there is a tie in any category, you will receive the same instructions again for a tiebreaker election.
