FROM THE DEAN

Dear Colleagues and Friends,

Sharron Lyon sent an email to let the membership know Sir David Willcocks unfortunately cancelled for our 9/11 service. The London papers were quite full of warnings to the British about not flying to the United States at this time. Also just of note, the wonderful New York City's St. Luke's Orchestra has been obliged to cancel its appearance at the British Promenade Concerts and at the Edinburgh Festival. How can such evil continue to exist in our world?

We are so grateful that someone of Dr. Gerre Hancock's stature is able to come to Nashville for the rehearsals and to conduct the Service of Remembrance and Hope at 7:30 PM on Monday, September 11, First Baptist Church, 108 7th Avenue South, downtown. Many of our members know him, have sung with him, or heard his choir and recordings. We will be delighted to work with him personally and musically to prepare a really meaningful memorial service.

Dr. Gerre Hancock, one of America's most highly acclaimed concert organists and choral directors, has recently been appointed to the Faculty of The University of Texas at Austin where he is developing a curriculum for the study of Sacred Music. Prior to this recent appointment, Dr. Hancock held the position of Organist and Master of Choristers at Saint Thomas Church, Fifth Avenue in New York City, where, for more than thirty years, he set a new standard for church music in America. A Fellow of the American Guild of Organists, Gerre Hancock has served on the faculty of The Juilliard School in New York City and taught improvisation on a visiting basis at the Institute of Sacred Music, Yale University in New Haven, CT, and The Eastman School of Music in Rochester, NY. In 1981 he was appointed a Fellow of the English Royal School of Church Music and in 1995 was appointed a Fellow of the Royal College of Organists. He is known for appearances at numerous Regional and National AGO Conventions as well as producing a large discography of choral recordings from St. Thomas Church and his own organ recordings.

The Service of Remembrance and Hope will be an interfaith service with readings and prayers. The Massed Choir will be conducted by Dr. Hancock with anthems and hymns, accompanied by Organ and Brass. The beautiful last movement of the CHICHESTER PSALMS by Leonard Bernstein will be accompanied by organ and harp. Andrew Risinger is the organist for the service and Carol McClure, harpist. There will be excellent brass players and timpani with the music being very stirring. We look forward to Dr. Hancock's organ improvisation near the opening of the service. **If an AGO singer wants to be part of the choir, he/she may call Wilma Jensen for information at 354-5563 or 202-9579.**

AGO members, we will not have the dinner before the service, but there will be a reception for all afterward arranged by Vicki Wright. With Dr. Hancock leading the MUSIC and the choir and congregation participating in a poignant LITURGY, the occasion should be a powerful and appropriate Remembrance of the fifth anniversary of the 9/11 tragedy. Please announce the Memorial Celebration in your bulletins and bring your friends and neighbors.

DEAN'S APPEAL FOR HELP

No, I am not drowning except in paper work which as many of you know is not my forte. But I am trying to "hang in there". The only times I have ever tried to raise money have been when I was assisting a church or music department asking for thousands or millions of dollars for new organs or new facilities. I buy Season Tickets to Nashville Opera because it has become so—o-o fabulous! Lisa Barry and I buy the very best tickets which we both think are mighty expensive. However, in Nashville Opera's appeal for extra gifts for sponsorship, I was completely shocked to learn that ticket sales pay for only about one-third of the costs needed to produce a mainstage opera!

The Nashville AGO has a similar problem. A certain portion of the dues, different in each category whether for Regular Members, Special, Dual, Student, etc., goes to the National Organization. For the coming season our Chapter (if I understand it all correctly) has already paid \$7,018.50 to the National AGO. In order to fund all of our local costs, including creative, good programming, I estimate our dues cover only about 50%. The ads in the Yearbook pay for the Yearbook itself and if there is any left over it can go to overall costs including programming. We have an Endowment Fund of \$10,500.00 and we can use any interest from that for programming. Hopefully, after a National Convention in 2012, we will have additional monies in the Endowment Fund. However, there are quite a few years of programming before that time for which we need help. If you are able to assist the AGO financially or you know of someone else who might be generous enough to help in our support, please forward these gifts to Nashville AGO in care of Jonathan Setzer, Treasurer.

TOWN HALL RESERVATIONS NEEDED EARLY

Make your plans now to attend the October 2nd Town Hall Meeting. This is the first major event for our entire chapter since we were asked to host the 2012 National AGO Convention in Nashville. Every effort is being made to make this a chapter project and to have the grass roots of the chapter involved in the planning. We need for you to become fully informed about the work, and we want your input.

We are encouraging ALL CHAPTER MEMBERS TO ATTEND this event. We are very fortunate to be able to hold this event at the Centennial Club as guests of Gray Thornburg, a Chapter Friend/Member of *our* Nashville AGO Chapter. Not many outside groups are able to use this facility, and we can only do it because of the generosity of Gray Thornburg, who is also a member of the Centennial Club, and offered to be our host. However, this requires early reservations with money paid in advance. You are asked to make your reservation in advance. **There will be a table where you can sign up and pay the \$15 at the reception, following the September Program on 9/11, A Service of Remembrance and Hope.** You can also mail your \$15 check and reservations to Joyce Byrd, 5111 Marc Court, Nashville, TN 37211.

There will be Three Distinguished Guests from the National AGO, who will arrive in Nashville on Sunday, October 1. They will spend time becoming familiar with our city and what we have to offer for our convention. There will be **Dennis Elwell**, who was the Coordinator of the Philadelphia National AGO Convention, and who now serves as the National Councillor for Conventions, **Dr. Robert Tall**, who was the Coordinator of the Los Angeles National AGO Convention, and **Karen Rich**, who was the National Councillor for Conventions and Competitions at the time Nashville was selected to host the 2012 National AGO Convention.

WHAT WILL HAPPEN AT THE TOWN HALL MEETING?

We will assemble at 6 PM with Hors d'oeuvres and a chance for our chapter members to meet our distinguished guests in an informal setting. At 6:30 PM the doors will open to the Dining Room for a formal sit down gourmet dinner. At 7:15 PM, we will begin the actual Town Hall Meeting. Each of our distinguished guests will have 30 minutes to speak about what our chapter has to do to prepare for the 2012 National AGO Convention. Each one will focus on certain important areas of the convention planning and its execution. You will have a chance for questions and answers within their 30 minute time segment.

At 8:45 PM the most interesting part will occur, when you will be asked to brainstorm and bring your ideas to the table. This will be done around the dinner tables with a discussion led by members of the Steering Committee, and careful notes will be taken of all suggestions. **Here is the charge that I would like to assign to you**, and I would like for you to start thinking about this before you arrive on Monday, October 2nd: to dream — dreams without any restrictions of any kind...nothing is wrong, nothing is too expensive, nothing can't be done. The universe is at the Nashville Chapter's disposal.

Sharron Lyon will compile all of the ideas that come forth in this meeting, and they will be given to the specific convention committee chairs.

Before you leave, we are going to ask that **you list three areas (in order of preference) in which you would be willing to work, either to serve on a Committee or as a volunteer.** This convention is going to take all of us pulling together and everyone working. However, our Nashville Chapter has a reputation for planning and executing First Class events. This will be our largest opportunity to show our ability to host the most important Convention of the National American Guild of Organists.

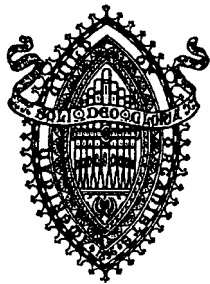
