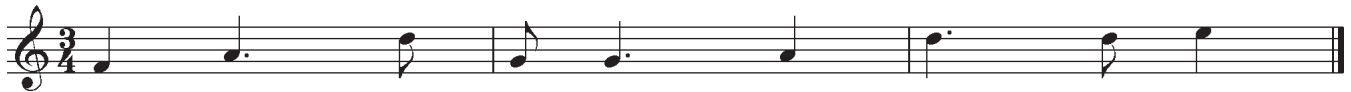
## FROM THE DEAN

With 75% of the room occupied, the whole Center was buzzing with excitement to hear the Martin Foundation Concert Organ. Our fabulous flyer introduced our chapter on one side and our hosting the 2012 National Convention on the other. Wearing the 2012 buttons created much fodder for opening conversations with others. The 2012 word is out now, and we will continue to work with the Nashville Symphony staff on future solo concerts such as this one.

Vincent Dubois made Nashville sound superb in more ways than one. His playing was dramatic, musical, refreshing, and energetic. Mr. Dubois focused his registration on accenting the varied sounds of the instrument. Unless you are able to attend one of Andrew Risinger's noonday concerts, our only chance to hear the organ is with the symphony — not bad here, but sometimes we just want to hear the organ.

One of Mr. Dubois' submitted themes for improvisation was 'Nashville' set to notes corresponding to the alphabet scheme, French style, of course.



So as you can see, the notes are not the most lyrical melody (theory teachers don't even think about sight-singing exams)! Intertwining this 'lovely' melody with *The Tennessee Waltz* finished the concert with smiles and warm hearts from everyone. And Nashville sounded GREAT!

Our *International Year of the Organ* celebration is off to an incredible start. Let's keep the momentum going, as we have not one, but two organists performing on Sunday, November 9. How often do we get a chance to hear organ duets and duos? The next evening, Monday, November 10, we have our first 'regular' chapter dinner and program meeting. We will hear and learn about the organ music of Calvin Hampton. I hope to see you then.

**Name:** Daniel Siao

**Where did you grow up:** Taipei, Taiwan 1990-1998; Brentwood, TN 1998-present

**Where did you study music and who were your organ teachers or list other degrees/majors, if you prefer:** High School: Interlochen Arts Academy, organ and composition, organ with Thomas Bara; composition with Dr. John Boyle Jr. College: MTSU, Angela Tipps. I'm pursuing an aerospace degree with a concentration in Pro-Pilot and a music minor.

**List the churches/institutions where you have played and/or conducted and/or taught, etc.** and number of years OR your present line of work: Played organ and piano at First Baptist Church of Traverse City, MI. I play piano at our church in Nashville, Nashville Chinese Baptist Church, whenever they need me to. I also play a little bit of electric bass if they need.

**List some of your accomplishments:** None in organ. Had some awards in Piano while studying at Blair School of Music, pre-college level.

**List funny and/or memorable experiences from your career in music:** In a recital at Interlochen, I had to crank the seat down 17 times because the guy in front of me was about 6'1", and a friend in the audience accidentally laughed out loud. And in our "organ building" class at Interlochen, we detached someone's pedal board and hid it in my organ practice room. We put the book "Pedal Techniques" by Joyce Jones on the console. He panicked for a little bit before we returned it.
