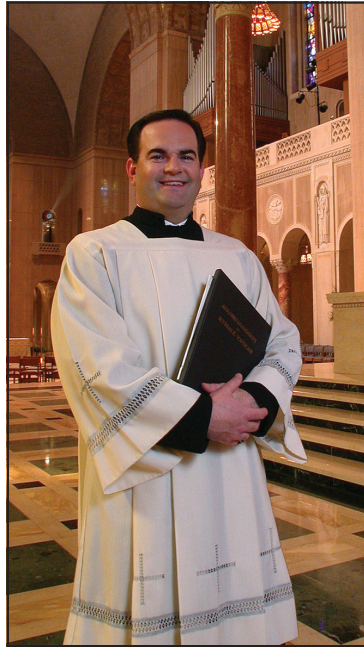

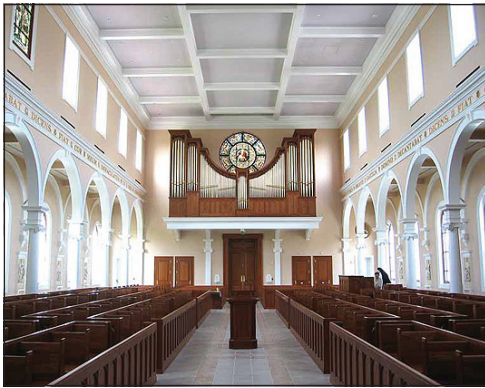

Dr. Latona will discuss the role of music in worship and explore the characteristics common to all music worthy of worship—regardless of denomination. **DR. PETER LATONA** leads one of the foremost liturgical music programs in the world. Known for his work as a performer, composer, and conductor, Dr. Latona was commissioned to compose music for the visit of His Holiness Benedict XVI to the U.S. in 2008. In addition, he holds numerous awards and prizes for excellence in organ performance and has appeared as a guest artist with several instrumental and choral ensembles throughout the United States and Europe. A graduate of the Manhattan School of Music (D.M.A.), Yale School of Music (M.M.), and Bucknell University (B.Mus.), Dr. Latona's teachers include McNeil Robinson and Thomas Murray (organ), and Jean Langlais and Gerre Hancock (improvisation).

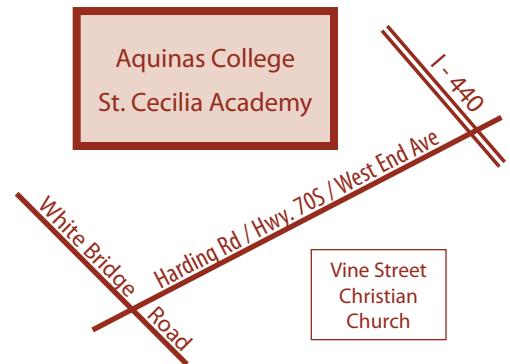
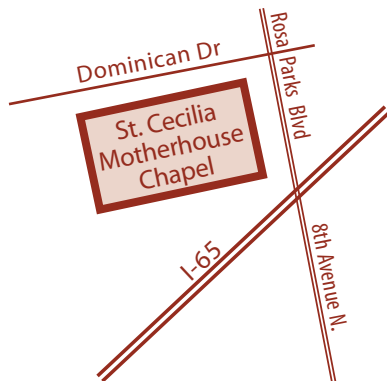

# UPDATE

Plans for the AGO 2012 National Convention are moving along in the fast lane. There already has been a great deal of important, preliminary work done behind the scenes. After Michael Velting and I make our program and budget proposal to the National Council in Baltimore during the week of October 10, and upon their approval, we will be able to begin sharing more specific information about convention plans. However, contracts will have to be negotiated and finalized before we can “go public.”

There are some committee chairs who deserve a special word of thanks for their heroic efforts to date:

- First, I must say a hearty thank you to **PAT BERTHELOT** and **JULIA CALLAWAY** for the remarkable job they did in organizing volunteers to staff our booth at the D.C. Convention. Their organizational skills were demonstrated as the Nashville 2012 exhibit ran like clockwork.
- The Program Committee has assembled a fabulous program, and we’re anxious to share it with you—after the approval from National Council, of course. **MICHAEL VELTING** has spent untold hours putting the performances and performance budget in a form that the National Council will hopefully adopt.
- **RICHARD SHADINGER** and **JOYCE BYRD** have worked to develop an itemized Convention Master Budget, pulling together figures from each area and assembling the budget in National

Council’s prescribed manner. They’ve done a masterful job with this exacting and detailed work.

- The Worship Committee has been very active under the leadership of **DON MARLER**, and they are very close to finalizing the plans for the three convention worship services. They have commissioned two major composers to write anthems that will be premiered at two of the services.
- **DOUG MURRAY** has done a fantastic job designing ads for the past two National Convention program books. He has also gathered together other promotional items to give out at the two previous National Conventions. There are several people in our chapter who have contributed to this work, plus Doug has been able to acquire some support from the Nashville Convention Bureau. I am proud that our advertising has looked so professional.
- **MURRAY SOMERVILLE** and his New Music Committee have commissioned four renowned composers to write pieces that will be premiered at the convention. You can read about these on the Convention Website, <[www.ago2012.org](http://www.ago2012.org)>.
- **SHARRON LYON** and **PAT PARRIS** are to be commended for designing our Convention website and posting the information as it becomes available.

Many other committees are hard at work, and you will hear more and more as we move closer to the convention date.

It is with deep regret that I announce **PAT BERTHELOT** has resigned as the Chair for the Volunteers Committee due to health reasons and at the recommendation of her doctor. She will continue to work with the committee, but not as chair. Pat has done a fabulous job, and the Executive Steering Committee is in the process of nominating her replacement.

In the months ahead, every member of our chapter will be called upon to assist in the preparation for this convention. When you are called, I hope your answer will always be, “Yes, I am willing to help.” This is *your* convention, and we all are eager to make Nashville look great and to let the world know how fabulous the Nashville AGO is.

I have an ongoing request for you. Many of us have AGO friends in other chapters and cities. As you communicate with them, remember to invite them to Nashville on July 1–6, 2012. If you are a member of a social network (such as Facebook or Twitter), use it to start promoting the convention. Help us to keep the Nashville Convention in front of our musician friends from now until July 2012. Your personal invitation is the most effective advertisement we have.

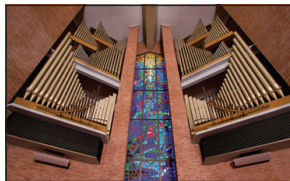

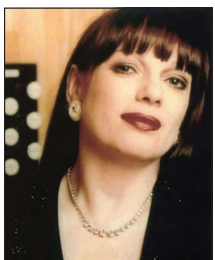
